identify and manage risk.

It provides practical tools and activities to

It also examines the latest methodologies,
developments and research in the area of risk
and controls in an Australasian context.

Now more than ever, there is a real need to
manage risk in this volatile world.

Controls alone cannot ensure success.
Bad decisions, poor managers, collusion,
competition and staff who choose to ignore
controls will always present problems.
However, a good control environment sets
the organisational standard. An effective
system of internal controls should maximise
achievement of objectives and avoid
unpleasant surprises.

A successful control system enables the
organisation to achieve effectiveness of
operations, reliability of information and meet
its compliance objectives.

While much has been written on risk and
controls in the last few years, little has been
done to educate staff in how to understand,
contribute and review the controls system in
their workplace.

This course aims to provide participants
with the fundamental information to review,
implement and improve the monitoring and
control of risk in their organisation.
